## TD GREAT CANADIAN SHORELINE CLEANUP IN OTTAWA

**CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS FOR MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 22**

RIDEAU VALLEY, September 15, 2008 — The TD Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup is happening across Canada again between September 20 and 28. It started 15 years ago as a conservation initiative of the Vancouver Aquarium and has now grown into the second largest cleanup in the world!

Our own City Stream Watch participates in the TD Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup helping pick up some of the garbage that has accumulated in our local Ottawa streams. This year, we are continuing with our focus on Sawmill Creek, and we will be doing a cleanup from the Heron Road creek crossing working our way upstream. The City Stream Watch program team of community volunteers has already successfully cleaned up two other parts of Sawmill Creek this year.
