ANOTHER MAJOR ECOGIFT FROM MONARCH HOMES

RIDEAU VALLEY, November 18, 2008 — Monarch Homes recently made another very significant donation of \$7,500 to the Rideau Valley Conservation Foundation for use in the Environmental Land Fund. Monarch's tradition of protecting key pieces of environmental land for future generations continues.

Monarch Homes continues to play a major role in helping us sustain the health of the Rideau River by providing the means to bring donated private lands into the public domain.
