You will work out of our Workshop located on Dilworth Road just south of Kars.

There is no public transportation to the worksite; candidates should ensure they have reliable transportation prior to applying.

Work Schedule is Monday through Thursday 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Friday 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

You may work on carpentry projects such as building picnic tables and boardwalks. You might be planting trees, laying down turf and tending gardens. You may even find yourself building gates and tearing down fences. You'll have the satisfaction of working hard and seeing results.

We offer you comprehensive training for the safe operation and maintenance of grounds-keeping equipment such as riding lawn mowers and trimmers as well as first-aid and defensive driving. You'll also become familiar with the Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS).

As the ideal candidate, you are a **post-secondary student** who enjoys working in the great outdoors and has some experience working with tools and equipment. The physically demanding work requires that you are able to navigate unstable terrain and lift up to 50 lbs. You don't mind working in adverse weather conditions like heat and rain. You must have a valid Class G2 or better driver's license and a clean driving record.
