8.0 Governing Policies Update

Ms. Livingston provided a brief overview and history of the Mississippi Rideau Source Protection Committee's (MR SPC) Rules of Procedure, Code of Conduct and Conflict of Interest Policies specifically regarding Chair appointments. She highlighted the situation in 2022 when the longtime MR SPC Chair did not seek reappointment after his term expired, and emphasized that the Minister of Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) has not appointed a new Chair since then. Ms. Livingston explained the challenges of managing a Chair absence, which has resulted in time-consuming procedures and uncertainty in handling Chair duties between meetings.

To address these issues, Ms. Livingston presented a policy amendment proposing the election of an Interim Acting Chair in the absence of a Ministerial appointment.

In response to a member's inquiry, Ms. Livingston noted that this is the first time that there has been a Chair vacancy on the MR SPC. She discussed

the challenges and disadvantages associated with not having a Chair, including inconsistent Chair Pro Tempore appointments and a lack of representation at provincial meetings.
