

# Drinking water survey for Rideau Lakes region

Calling all cottagers! Our partners at the Mississippi-Rideau Source Protection Region are studying seven lakes in the Westport, Perth and Smiths Falls area to learn how property owners source their drinking water - whether it's from a well, the lake or carried in. A quick landowner survey will help staff determine where to focus education efforts to ensure people are accessing safe drinking water sources. If you've got property on Bass, Christie, Eagle, Otter, Otty, Upper Rideau or Wolfe lakes, complete the survey for a chance to win an annual pass to RVCA's 11 conservation areas (valued at \$50). #### Pilot project promotes sustainable drainage on Big Rideau Lake

A school of painted yellow fish has invaded Portland to send an important reminder that stormwater runs directly to our waterways – often carrying chemicals, nutrients and pollutants along with it. This can cause algae blooms, excessive weeds and reduced water quality in our beloved lakes. In partnership with the Township of Rideau Lakes, Big Rideau Lake Association and Cataraqui Conservation, a new pilot project this summer aims to monitor several Portland drains and offer easy sustainable drainage tips for residents, such as using a rain barrel or installing a rain garden. Our City Stream Watch program needs volunteers to help with two invasive species removals as well as in-depth stream surveys throughout the month of August. On Aug. 13 the team will remove Japanese knotweed from Sawmill Creek, and on Aug. 27 they'll remove European Frogbit and garlic mustard from the Jock River in Richmond.
