


## Spring Water Awareness

As warmer spring weather approaches, snow and ice melt and waterways begin to fill up with cold, fast-moving water. Children are often interested in exploring rushing streams and thawing ponds during the warm days of spring. However, these areas can be unsafe and it is important to teach about the dangers of these areas. RVCA has educational resources available through our Spring Water Awareness Program; these include background information about spring flooding, "Safety Says" video with teacher notes, activity ideas, resources and sheets for use by classroom teachers, general curriculum information, information for students to take home during flood season, posters and dam safety resource materials from Ontario Power Generation. ## Rideau Lakes Subwatershed Report

The *Rideau Lakes Subwatershed Report 2014* is now available. This is the last in a family of subwatershed reports that summarizes the health of one of the Rideau's six subwatersheds. These reports look at watershed



health indicators: water quality, forest cover, wetlands, shorelines and water quality. Residents and municipalities now have a reliable set of baseline information to track future trends and target stewardship initiatives in the Rideau Lakes. The report also highlights efforts to improve watershed health. Detailed technical catchments reports will also be available in the coming weeks. ## Jock River Project Wins Prestigious National Conservation Award

The RVCA, Ottawa Chapter of Muskies Canada, National Defence Headquarters Fish and Game Club and Ottawa Flyfishers Society are thrilled to announce that they have won the Top Canadian Fishing Industry Conservation Project Award for 2014. The Jock River Fish Habitat Embayment Creation Project saw the creation of 1,000 square metres of new spawning, nursery, rearing and feeding habitat at the Richmond Conservation Area in the City of Ottawa. This transformation will support the 40 plus species of fish that reside in the Jock River — including muskellunge and northern pike. The new wetland will provide habitat to birds, amphibians and turtles and increase overall biodiversity. It will also improve shoreline stability and protect water quality. The project is a result of wonderful partners and the hard, diligent work of supportive volunteers. Jennifer Lamoureux, RVCA Biologist, along with project partners Peter Levick from Muskies Canada attended the official presentation at the Industry Breakfast on February 13 at the Spring Fishing and Boat Show at the International Centre in Mississauga. ## Restore Your Shore This Spring!

RVCA's Shoreline Naturalization Program is working with landowners to plant 5,000+ healthy, native trees and shrubs along waterways this spring. These new plants will help protect water quality, reduce erosion and enhance wildlife habitat. Want to participate next year? ## City Stream Watch—2014/2015 Update

2014 saw the City Stream Watch Program (CSW) examine four creek systems —Sawmill, Mud, Black Rapids and Cardinal Creeks. 288 dedicated volunteers participated for a total of 1,116 volunteer hours. Three kilometres of six different streams were cleaned, seven invasive species removed, 28 fish sampling sites and 14 temperature probes were installed. In 2015 CSW will re-examine streams surveyed in 2009, Barrhaven, Stillwater, Mosquito and Bilberry Creeks. Streams are surveyed every six years to determine how conditions have changed and to identify restoration and stewardship opportunities. CSW relies on and encourages community volunteers to learn about and conduct stream assessments. Guided by knowledgeable RVCA staff, volunteers participate in fish sampling, stream clean-ups, invasive species removals and stream rehabilitation projects. 
