Stay informed - Stay dry!

As the spring freshet continues, stay ahead of flooding by keeping tabs on our real-time water level data, subscribing to our Flood Forecasting alerts and following our social media channels for the most current flood status updates. Normal

No flood conditions exist.

Water Safety

High flows, unsafe banks, melting ice or other factors could create dangerous conditions. Flooding is not expected.

Flood Outlook

Early notice of the potential for flooding based on weather forecasts for heavy rain, snow melt, high wind or other conditions that could cause flooding or erosion

Flood Watch

Flooding is possible in specific watercourses or municipalities. Be prepared to activate your emergency response.

Flood Warning

Activate your flood response procedures now! Flooding is imminent or already occurring in specific watercourses or municipalities. Follow all guidance from local emergency response agencies.

Timely responses keep permit applications moving

If you're applying for a Section 28 permit this year, rest assured you'll get an answer in a timely fashion. In 2022, all but 2 of the 315 permits approved by RVCA under Section 28 of the *Conservation Authorities Act* were issued within provincial timelines – that's a 99% success rate! The Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry states that major projects should be approved within 90 days, while minor projects should be approved within 28 days. RVCA also strives to meet more aggressive timelines encouraged by Conservation Ontario and can report that half of the 315 permits issued last year were issued in half the time stipulated by the Province. Just in time for spring, Chapman Mills Conservation Area will fully reopen in April after a new pedestrian bridge was installed on the evening of Sunday, March 19. The 60-foot accessible span was lifted in by crane and will provide a wider, safer walkway over the trail's northern storm drain. New hazard mapping funding approved

RVCA staff have initiated preliminary data collection for hazard mapping projects in two regions, thanks to federal funding from the Flood Hazard Identification and Mapping Program. In the lower watershed, the federal government will provide \$144,000 towards work on Brassils Creek, Greens Creek, Sawmill Creek, Graham Creek, Stillwater Creek and Faulkner Drain. In the upper watershed, the federal government will provide \$160,000 towards preliminary hazard mapping work around Lower Rideau Lake, Big Rideau Lake, Bobs Lake and Otty Lake.
